Zoning Out on the Lake



I was recently asked to turn this large, but amazing space into the perfect multi-purpose game room, dining room, lounging room and living space, all for a family of four and their friends.

those open shelves with pretty upholstered doors to hide all of the clutter. The upper doors slide open to expose a large TV and a new sofa and four chairs combine to create the perfect media zone. We created a separate space for gaming by moving the pool table to the other side of the room, and tucked a round table and chairs for party food or lunch into the bay of windows with dreamy views of the lake. Once I had created my zones, I pulled all my colors, keeping in mind the flow from the upstairs to the down. We chose cool tones with blues and a touch of teal - very "water-like" clean, crisp and calm. New wall colors, new tile floor and all the textiles jive with each other for a visually open and clutter-free look.❖

SECRETS TO THE DESIGN

- All walls, trim, ceiling and cabinets in varying shades of the same color
- Floating furniture into the space to create zones for a more cozy feel
- Large-scale lighting for expansive ceilings
- Custom doors on open bookcases to streamline the look
- A sofa console with chairs adds even more TV-watching and snacking seating options
- Wood tile floors are perfect for wet lake feet
